Seasons Greetings from John & Donna




Horses pulling the Christmas Sleigh through the snow. Studio painting 16 x 20 acrylic is this years Christmas painting

If you have not heard of ITP, it is low platelet count that causes bleeding under the skin resulting in petechiae. When we saw that it meant a trip to the emergency room. Our friend there in Barga drove us to the ER, helped with translation and emotional support. We found out the staff was goggling ITP, not very confidence inspiring. But they did get him stable after 3 days. We decide to cut the trip short and head back to Boston and Vermont. We both got airplane flu on the flight back and that caused a relapse of the ITP in John, this time he ended up in Dartmouth-Hitchcock in Hanover NH where they clarified the I in ITP stood for immune.

We decided that our new definition of a good vacation is one where we both come home alive.
