My watercolor for Christmas this year is the **Christmas Palm Tree**, scientific name *Veitchia merrillii*. During summer months the Christmas Palm produces light green flower buds that turn into creamy blossom. In December flowers are followed by green oval fruits that turn bright red as they ripe. Berrie-like fruits are 1 inch long and 1/5 inch wide. They hang in clusters looking like Christmas ornament, therefore palm's common name is Christmas Palm. I've shown the palm here with some of the most beautiful ornaments from the sea, sand dollars and star fish.
